IWUA SETS ANNUAL SUMMER WATER LAW AND RESOURCE SEMINAR FOR JUNE 16 & 17 AT SUN VALLEY RESORT

Organizers say this year's annual Idaho Water Users Association's Summer Water Law and Resources Issues seminar will cover some of the most crucial issues in the past several years.

The seminar, set for June 16 and 17 in Sun Valley, will delve into issues ranging from the possibilities of new dams and reservoirs to new Federal plans to help protect endangered salmon.

A variety of panels and workshops will examine a wide range of issues including:

- New Water Storage: What is in the works?;
- Water Delivery Call Litigation Update;
- Federal Dams, Water and Salmon Harvest: What do the new biological opinions mean for all of us;
- The Comprehensive Aquifer Management Plan: What did we decide; where are we going next?;
- Strategies For Demand Reduction on the ESPA: The Pristine Springs Deal;
- Clean Water Act, Litigation and Regulatory Update; and
- Encroachments & Discharges Into Canals: The Dos and Don'ts

“This particular summer seminar truly will be the water-related mother lode for the most sensitive and significant issues on the local and national table. It is one of our best seminars in years,” said Norm Semanko, IWUA Executive Director.

Another unique element will be “The SRBA Turns 20: Reflections From The Bench.” This highly unusual, if not unique, presentation features a panel composed of all four Idaho judges who have or are presiding over the historic Snake River Basin Adjudication process.
