### **IWUA SETS ANNUAL SUMMER WATER LAW SEMINAR FOR JUNE 27 & 28 AT SUN VALLEY RESORT**

Idaho's largest water user organization will hold its annual Summer Water Law and Resource Issues Seminar June 27 and 28 at the Sun Valley Resort in Sun Valley, the Idaho Water Users Association announced today.

The annual summer seminar is Idaho's premier water seminar because it consistently deals with the latest developments in critical water and environmental issues from both the private sector and government perspectives.

This year's edition of the seminar will use both panels and workshops to focus on key issues including:

- Waters of the U.S.: EPA's New Guidance;
- The Supreme Court Speaks: Conjunctive Management Update – What the Court Said, What it Means and Where Do We Go Next;
- Water Markets and Land Use Changes in Idaho and the West;
- Recovery Plan for Fall Chinook;
- NPDES Pesticide General Permit Update; and
- Municipal Water Rights: Recent Developments and Future Needs.

Other panels will look at crucial water user topics such as “Ag To Urban: Land Use and Water Delivery” and “Did You Know That Your Canal Bank was a Flood Levee?”

Featured speakers include the Commissioner of the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, Michael Connor, from Washington, D.C., and Professor Francis McGovern from Duke University School of Law, as well as Idaho Department of Water Resources Director Gary Spackman.

“These are the kinds of important water related topics that provide water managers and others involved in irrigation the kinds of vital insights into the challenges they will face in the future,” said Norm Semanko, IWUA Executive Director.
